For SOKA-BAU, supporting vocational training in the construction sector is a key concern. This is expressed in particular in the pay-as-you-go vocational training support scheme, which is implemented throughout the industry. It is designed to ensure the high quality and attractiveness of vocational training in the construction branch. The success speaks for itself: the construction training market has developed positively despite the COVID pandemic. New apprenticeships rose to around 14.180 in 2020, representing the highest number of apprenticeships in 20 years.

Within the YES project, the question is how cross-border activity of apprentices could be facilitated. What is carried out as a matter of course by the ERASMUS program for students is still the exception for apprentices. The advantages of a stay abroad are obvious for a Europe that has grown together: not least, both the employer and the industry benefit from learning to deal with unfamiliar situations and from the apprentice's expansion of the wealth of experience. It is therefore important to create a situation, that a temporary stay abroad is not a hurdle but an enrichment. For this purpose, it is necessary to know and analyze the individual systems of vocational training. This is the only way to integrate a stay abroad into the training in a meaningful way, so that apprentices and companies experience it as a supplement and not as an interruption - or even a disruption - of the training.
